PREPARE YOUR DOG FOR EMERGENCIES

When preparing your dog for a fire, it's important to create a plan that includes your pet. Make sure your dog is wearing a collar with identification tags and that their microchip information is up to date. Practice evacuation drills with your dog so they become comfortable with the routine and know what to expect. Create an emergency kit for your dog that includes food, water, medications, and their favorite toy or blanket. If possible, arrange a safe place for your dog to stay during a fire, such as a friend or family member's home

Recall- 'Come boy'

Does your dog have a great recall even when there are distractions? During an emergency increased activity, noises and much more can make recalls much harder for pets

Look at Me

What does your dog look at when faced with something exciting or scary? Teach your pup to look to you for guidance in stimulating situations

Collar Grab

Many Dogs can find people grabbing at them scary. During a panicked situation this is what many of us will do. You can teach your dog to accept and even love the collar grab!

Crates/ Cages

Even if your dog doesn't usually use a crate it is important you teach them to use one should it be needed during evacuations or transport during an emergency. You can associate the crate with his favorite things and even teach him to hop in by himself.
